It is estimated that 1 in 10 women with HMB has an inherited bleeding disorder.¹

Symptoms of bleeding disorders in women

The most common symptom you might have is heavy menstrual bleeding (HMB). HMB is usually defined as a week or more of heavy bleeding, often with large blood clots.

In addition to very heavy periods, other symptoms include:

- Anemia
- Hemorrhagic ovarian cysts
- Increased miscarriages early in pregnancy
- Post-partum hemorrhaging
- Post-surgical bleeding
- Endometriosis
- Painful or swollen joints
- Painful periods
- Bruising easily
- Bleeding gums
- Bloody noses

Diagnosing and testing for a bleeding disorder

Testing for a bleeding disorder is a simple blood draw. You and your doctor will need to coordinate the testing with your menstrual cycle. Many drugs can impact the results. Be sure to tell your doctor about any drugs or supplements you're taking.

If the test shows you have a bleeding disorder, your medical team can create a treatment plan that works for you.
